Hi

Yesterday I heard a witness quote IPCC evidence that in waste incineration one tonne of fuel equates to one tonne of CO2 emitted. This did not tally with what I had heard previously so I thought I would check and found an IPCC document that states

"The incineration of 1 Mg of municipal waste in MSW incinerators is associated with the production/release of about 0.7 to 1.2 Mg of carbon dioxide (CO2 output)."

Also, after I gave my statement I heard the appellants state that effects of terrain had been dealt with in their submission. I did not think the appellants dealt with these effects adequately and in the interest of brevity I did not seek to elaborate on the uncertainties involved in air dispersion modelling. I enclose a reference to an expert witness statement from another incinerator enquiry that the Inspector might find of value paras 2.6 and 2.8 of particular value in this respect.

I hope this is helpful and if I there are any queries I would be pleased to try and answer them. Dr Tony Dobbs
